Pastor Mark's Meanderings

Our theological task is to create a faith that is vulnerable enough to be compassionate and grace-filled, but also strongly grounded in the teachings and example of Jesus so we are not torn apart by the strains of life.— Mark Johnson



Dear Friends,

Recently, our grandson sent Sandi and me his senior pictures; and my

favorite shows him with his dog and his guitar. I smiled as I remembered being his age and feeling like the only ones in the world who understood me were my dog and my guitar.

Maybe you remember those days, too?

Maybe it was a coincidence that the leader of our church youth group introduced me to a luthier, someone who made and repaired stringed instruments. Being in his workshop was breathtaking. I knew something of working with wood - building fences and cowsheds - but never had I seen the kind of tools used to create violins and guitars. His tools made amazingly precise cuts and created wooden pieces that were perfectly shaped to fit together. He told me that the trick to building an instrument was to cut and sand the wood thin enough to resonate, but braced well enough that the tension of the strings would not pull the instrument apart.

Just as a luthier uses special tools and techniques to create instruments which, in the hands of a skilled musician, can create beautiful music, so every Jesus follower uses a theologian's tools to learn about God, humankind and the relationship between God and humankind. A

luthier seeks to build an instrument that is thin enough to vibrate but strong enough to withstand the tension of the strings. Our theological task is to create a faith that is vulnerable enough to be compassionate and grace-filled, but also strongly grounded in the teachings and example of Jesus so we are not torn apart by the strains of life.

A luthier uses many tools to cut, shape, and fit their instrument but United Methodist theologians, like you and me, use four tools in our theological task. These are sometimes called the Wesleyan Quadrilateral and are based on Dr. Albert Outler's study of John Wesley's theological method. The four tools are: scripture, tradition, reason and experience. (You can use the acronym REST – reason, experience, scripture, and tradition to help you remember.) Our United Methodist Discipline states: "Wesley believed that the living core of the Christian faith was revealed in Scripture, illumined by tradition, vivified in personal experience, and confirmed by reason. Scripture [however] is primary, revealing the Word of God 'so far as it is necessary for our salvation."

A luthier understands the purpose of each tool he or she uses. United Methodist theologians also understand the uses of our tools:

Scripture, the Bible, is God's printed word pointing to the living Word, Jesus Christ.

Tradition is the way the church has experienced, worshipped and understood the mystery of our Triune God. Foremost in our tradition is the discernment and experience of the Mothers and Fathers of the Church since ancient times. For United Methodists, helpful references include our hymnal, Book of Worship, and Book of Discipline.

Experience is the way we individually, and as a church, experience the Holy in our midst.

Reason is applying the understandings of logic, science, social science and, sometimes, plain old common sense to our theological ponderings.

Our Book of Discipline states that each point of the Quadrilateral is a "source and criteria" for our theological task. That means we can start our theologizing with either scripture, reason, experience or tradition and in the course of our study we include the learnings derived from the other three tools.

The next question is: Where do we do the work of a theologian?
Where is a theologians workshop?
We'll consider that next month.

Business Office Tips

Here is some helpful information from your Business Office! Do you know there are several different ways to send us your contributions? All contributions must be submitted to the Business Office by **December 29th** to receive credit on your 2017 contribution statement.

Here are the different ways to send in your contributions:

- Cash or Check placed in the offering plate during worship. Please consider using an envelope including your name when donating cash.
- Drop off Donation in door slot of the main office attention Business Office.
- Mail check donations by the US Postal service to Towson **UMC** attention Business Office
- Online Banking you set up online checking with your bank. You control the frequency and amount sent. The bank sends a check to Towson UMC. Set up Towson UMC as a "vendor" and include your envelope number if you have one —and name as "account number."
- Online-Giving (Credit Cards and Electronic Funds Transfers) Giving online with credit cards and with electronic fund transfers are easy and allows you to set up automatic recurring contributions. Contributions can now be deducted automatically from your checking or savings account at any time or processed using your credit or debit card. Our electronic giving program offers convenient ways for you to give from any device (computer or phone) anywhere you have access to the Internet.


