Message from Pastor Mark

Dear Friends,

Thank you for your participation in Christ's ministries at Towson United Methodist Church during 2018. Our vibrant congregation welcomed 20 new members + 5 confirmands; and worship attendance increased 15%. Our best estimate is that 200 Towson UMC family members are actively involved in ministry. And, hundreds more are served by our church's mission projects.

Your prayers, presence, service, witness and giving have empowered incredible ministries that — by the power of the Holy Spirit— change lives. Our vital work reaches many different people, not only in our congregation, but also in our community and around the world.

In many ways, Towson UMC — like so many other churches — faces an uphill battle in 2019.

- Perhaps folks are not as inclined to hear the message of the Gospel? But, the good news of Jesus Christ has often been at odds with culture. Paul wrote "For the mes-

sage about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God." (1 Corinthians 1: 18)



- Perhaps people are tempted to focus on things, ideas and activities that compete with what Jesus identified as our eternal priorities — loving God and neighbor? This dilemma has always existed. (Matthew 22: 36-40)

We must remain steadfast in our faith. Like the caterpillar who retreats into a deep transformative chrysalis, we must wait until the future reveals itself. Remember that we serve a God of resurrection, who is constantly making all things new.



Dozens of church members and friends chartered a bus and traveled to Washington, D.C. to “Unite in Love” in peaceful demonstration of kindness during the Unite the Right rally in August. Local Baltimore TV station WBFF covered the story from the church parking lot to share our advocacy adventure and message of Jesus’ love with all.

In February, a neighborhood family stopped by church to share the “give away” portion of their youngsters’ allowance. Two girls, ages 7 and 9 years old, bought and delivered chunky soups and other hearty foods to help fill the bellies of someone in need at our Food Pantry.

Stories of compassion and hope

Across the globe, Baltimore missionaries Nathan and Anna Glenn are sponsored by Towson UMC. They reflected on their work in Liberia to help local farmers and entrepreneurs learn about sustainable agricultural practices and economic small business management: “[We] have been blessed to be here working with...Hope in the Harvest...toward eradication of poverty...[We] have repeated opportunities to share the Word of God and experience and pursue Christ together.”



The weekly Men’s Prayer Breakfast at a local diner is an early-morning wake up call with God. As one member related, “This is a deep dive into the Sunday Gospel message and another way to connect with parishioners ... everyone is welcome for prayer and fellowship.”

The inaugural Refresh & Reboot event in November explored the topic “Living Joyfully in Stressful Times” and brought together women of all ages to relax, learn, and connect. From the superb keynote speaker to the delicious food and loving atmosphere, attendees raved: “This was just what I needed” on life’s journey.



In the summer, an inter-generational group of enthusiastic members joined together to learn and play the ukulele. The new Ukulele Choir became a strumming sensation at Sunday worship and other events. One musician remarked, “I’m so grateful for this choir. As a new member, this smaller group helps me feel more comfortable at church.”
