Pastor Mark's Meanderings



Dear Friends,

I had an interesting conversation the other day about why we repeat an Affirmation of

Faith and the Lord's Prayer in worship. Good question. Sometimes it seems like when we repeat the same things every Sunday we often do so without thinking about what we are saying. When that happens our worship might feel routine, automatic, and without meaning.

The interesting thing is that in most other areas of our lives, we work hard for things to become automatic. It is said that the difference between a good golfer and touring professional is that after playing 18 holes, a good player goes into the clubhouse to relax. But a professional golfer, after playing 18 holes, goes to the driving range and hits 500 balls to perfect her swing and then puts in another few hours on the putting green. In athletics, music and in many other endeavors, enthusiasts practice and practice so that, when confronted with an unusual situation, their response is easy, predictable, and automatic.

Might that same be true of our faith? We repeat the Lord's Prayer so when we are confronted by a crisis that needs prayer, we have a prayer memorized to start us. We repeat Affirmations of Faith in worship so that when we are confronted with a choice that demands we know what we believe, we have an outline in mind. Many other spiritual disciplines guide and mold us the same way.

I am writing these things just days after the demonstrations in Charlottesville, VA during which neo -Nazis, white supremacists and other fascists brutally attacked, injured and killed counter-protestors. If there was ever a time for people of faith to know what we believe in, then it is now.

Pastor Mark's Meanderings

...a United Methodist Church they are asked "Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your sin?" The candidate answers (hopefully) "I do."

Then they are asked "Do you accept the freedom and power God gives you to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves?" The answer, again, is "I do."

Finally, the candidate is asked, "Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior, put your whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as your Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races?" "I do."

After these three confessions are made, the candidate makes vows and the rest of the ritual of baptism, confirmation, or membership continues. But for a moment, I would like us to dwell on these confessions. We renounce wickedness, reject evil and repent of our sin. We accept God-given freedom and the power to resist evil, injustice and oppression. We confess Jesus, trust his grace and promise to serve him in union with Christ's diverse church. These confessions are the foundation of who we are as Jesus' followers.

At Towson UMC, we broaden the description of who we are as Christ's Church — stating that everyone, regardless of ability, class, race, gender, culture, age,



sexual preference and so on, are welcome to become Christ's church with us and to share with us in being Christ's church for the world.

What that means is: everything about us, from our historic confessions to our most recent welcoming statement, says "NO!" to those who propose to create, in the United States, a society based on hate, bigotry, class, violence, and oppression. As a professional athlete relies on years of practice to see himself through challenging situations, these are the times when we as God's own children must call on the lessons and confessions of our faith.

How shall we say "No!" to hate and bigotry and "Yes!" to peace, grace, and tolerance - and to the magnificent diversity of God's creation? While we, God willing, may never have to confront a fascist demonstration in our community, there are things we can do.

Be Christ's Church of love, grace and mercy. Get to know other church members. Laugh with them and cry with them. Be there for them and let them be there for you. Pray together. Learn with them. Serve with them. Share life together. Let your experience of giving and receiving love transform your pre-conceptions about people who are different.

Demand that our political leaders unequivocally support the traditional values of our country including decency, generosity, tolerance, inclusion, justice, equality and peace. Remind them in person, through communications and through the ballot box that the ends do not justify the means, the means create the ends.

Finally, understand that the only hope for us as individuals, families, communities and nation is Jesus. That is not to say that we disrespect other religions. Far from it, we participate with everyone in creating just and peaceful communities. Yet we are always focused and prepared to humbly share and serve others in the love and name of Jesus.

I've been with you for six weeks. This is my second *High Spire l*etter. Truly, I expected this article to be much more peaceful and pastoral. Yet, I do not feel that anyone is served unless I honestly share my heart, faith, and call with you. I realize I have may have unknowingly stated things in a way that some may find offensive. That certainly is not my plan. If I have offended you, then let's get together, have a cup of coffee, and talk.

Please hold me, my family, our church and our country in prayer even as I hold you and yours in prayer. See you in worship!






Food Pantry News


