

Pastor's Letter

Artistic Selves

My grandmother, my father's mother, was an artist. A favorite story in my family is that she worked for a china company in Philadelphia — hand painting beautiful roses on fragile tea cups. Each of my siblings and I have her paintings of roses and other subjects proudly hung around our homes. Many are watercolors of summer scenes at the beach and winter scenes in the mountains. One that I have is a delicate arrangement of tiny leaves and flowers. Another of my favorites — which remained a mystery for years — is of a small clown standing on a bumble bee. You may have already guessed what we eventually realized, is that she fancifully copied the joker card from a deck of Bumble Bee playing cards.





Artists have a way of seeing what many of us pass every day and take for granted. They give us a glimpse inside reality and invite us to take in messages of beauty, wonder, longing, humor, serenity, and so much more, by including us in their dance with light, color, line, and texture.

My little granddaughter gives us her paintings and artistic creations every time we see her. She can't get enough of creating from all the resources at her disposal. And of course, every one of them is beautiful. She reminds me that we all have an artist inside us waiting to come out.

I know that many of you are artists and that you express your

creativity in varied ways. Painting, photography, home decorating, singing, writing poetry, blogging, cooking, gardening, tinkering, — there are so many ways to engage in our birthing potential.

If we think a moment, we can imagine God as the consummate artist. God not only created all the way back at the beginning - God is continuing to create all around us every day. God's perspective includes every tiny detail as well as scenes of infinite grandeur. The intensely personal and the most public of all. Each of our artistic creations can easily be viewed as co-creations with God. For, by making us in God's image, we are generously endowed with continually discoverable creative gifts by our Creator.

Sometimes we are shy or overly cautious about exploring what is inside us waiting to come out. We hold back our creative urges and hide our gifts under a bushel basket. Jesus said, "Let your light shine, and let the world see your good gifts so others may see them and also give glory to God." (Matthew 5:16) The Message puts it like this: "Here's another way to put it: You're here to be light, bringing out the God-colors in the world. God is not a secret to be kept. We're going public with this, as public as a city on a hill... (so) Keep open house; be generous with your lives. By opening up to others, you'll prompt people to open up with God, this generous Father in heaven."

So let's open up and share our artistic selves as God does so generously — and let others in to see the creative wonder God has planted in each of us.

Araminta's vision of seeing every child free from human trafficking was born.

Araminta's mission is threefold:

- To awaken, equip, and mobilize the Church and our community to dismantle child sex trafficking in our region.
- To engage in prevention, intervention and survivor services that bring healing and wholeness.
- To challenge each individual to recognize their



SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP AT TOWSON

8:15 AM Traditional Service in the Chapel. This service has communion every Sunday and usually piano or organ accompaniment.

10:15 AM Worshipping God Together in the Sanctuary. This service is blended and richly varied. About twice a month we open with contemporary songs led by our praise band. And, about twice a month we are more traditional, with one of these Sundays including an old-fashioned-hymn-sing. Every Sunday, we hear from the 3,000 pipes of our glorious organ. And, every Sunday we are blessed by one or more of our five vocal choirs or three handbell choirs. You may hear anything from an a cappella anthem in Latin from the 1500s, to a classic with the organ, to a recent song accompanied by our praise band. Communion is offered on the first Sunday of the month, and is open to all.

We have gluten-free bread, too, just ask the server.

See the chart outside the main office door — OR — call the church office at 410-823-6511 to order Flowers to be placed on the Altar and to light the Spire in honor or in memory of a loved one. Orders need to be placed by Noon Tuesday BEFORE the Sunday.

FLOWERS ON THE ALTAR may be given in honor of or in memory of loved ones.
 You have a choice when donating flowers for the altar: you may order arranged cut flowers that you take home after the 10:15 service on Sunday for \$30.00,
 OR — you may consider ordering from *Paul's Flowers*, which could be a lasting shrub or perennial flowers to be planted here at church for \$55.00. *Paul's Flowers* may be ordered April—Nov., and need a 2-week notice.

- If you would like a rosebud on the altar announcing the birth of your child or grandchild, please contact the church office at 410-823-6511.
- Donate to LIGHT THE SPIRE IN THE EVENING FOR THE WEEK in honor of or in memory of a loved ones.
