

Pastor's Letter

A Play of Threes



What happened on Calvary's hill outside of Jerusalem that day?

A multi-layered play of threes wove life, death, and resurrection into the very fabric of the world. From that day on, life's purpose took on meaning which is continuing to radiate like a pebble in a pond. Jesus hung on a cross for three hours between two thieves in the shadows of evil. He eventually spoke three words, "It is finished" and was laid in a tomb. Three days later, he rose from the dead to the astonishment of everyone who could see past the twos that competed for prominence. Hero or revolutionary? Imposter or the embodiment of truth? The Son of God or a mere miracle worker?

We, too, can get caught up in two thinking. Either Jesus is God or man. Either he rose from the dead or it is all an elaborate myth. Either he came to connect us to God or he was just a really good teacher. What is it? Decision time is readily thrust upon us.

Then what if Jesus is more than the either/or that the world (or we) have made him?
What if **he is the image of the unseen God, the first born of Creation, everything visible and invisible?** (Colossians 1: 15)

He is the image of God, Creator of everything.

And **through him, God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven by making peace by the blood of the cross.** (Colossians 1:20)

He is the reconciler of God, Redeemer through his blood.

And **in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the Church, so that he might come to have first place in everything.** (Colossians 1: 17-18)

He is the powerful glue of God, sustaining with his present presence.

When we see Jesus Christ from the perspective of threes, we are drawn into a reality that is vibrating with life and at the same time is more than we can describe with words. Twos can close us down. Threes can open us up. Twos can have sharp edges. Threes invite us to go where we have not easily or comfortably gone before. Twos can be under our control. Threes push us to a life-giving relationship beyond ourselves which we desperately need.

God of all that was, is, and shall be. We enter God's three strand woven reality during Holy Week and find that we are taken up in majesty, wonder, and awe.

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

May each day be the third day, Easter day, so that we may live with, in and through him all of our days.

SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP AT TOWSON

8:15 Traditional Service in the Chapel. This service has communion every Sunday and usually piano or organ accompaniment.



Slavery has existed in every society and in every generation. Due to slavery's legal abolition in many societies and the United States in the 19th century, it has taken on a different form and moved underground. Modern-day slavery exists in the form of human trafficking. In the United States, human traffickers have disproportionately preyed on the most vulnerable of our society: women and children.

Araminta focuses on the sex trafficking of minors within the United States.

Araminta's mission is to mobilize entire communities through the use of volunteers to overcome trafficking. While Araminta will utilize professionals such as psychologists, social workers, and attorneys in the rehabilitation process, we believe that volunteers who are trained and equipped properly will bring the numbers necessary to end trafficking in our community and provide resources to partner agencies.
