

Pastor's Letter

Sunday Morning Discernment

We are in the midst of discerning the way ahead for our Worship, Christian Education, and Fellowship on Sunday mornings. I would like to take this space to offer some perspectives and thoughts for our discernment process.

While we sometimes characterize the 9:00 AM Impact Service as contemporary and our 11:00 AM worship service as traditional, these words can be misleading. While the early service can be described as "more relaxed," "a little more conversational," "includes some newer music," and these shifts are important, there is much taking place in both worship services now which have made them more focused on connecting with people today.



In the past few years, we have begun using the projector and screen in worship at both worship services for words to songs and hymns and pictures related to the service, short video presentations, and other worship related visuals. Recent improvements to the sound system benefit both worship services including the addition of new microphones, a new digital sound board, and an upgraded hearing-assist system. We have intentionally included more lay participation in both worship services through faith sharing and witnessing. Lay persons have also been offering community prayers and we have had some experience with drama especially at the 9:00 AM worship

service. The way worship is offered today has been evolving and we can anticipate that worship will continue to evolve.

By discussing our Sunday Morning schedule and the potential for an adjustment, we have the opportunity to express what makes worship meaningful for us individually and collectively and to discuss and pray about what might be right for us now and in the future.

Christian Education has also evolved at TUMC. Children experience "Kids In the Disciple Zone" during the 9:00 AM hour followed by Sunday School. Our Confirmation and youth classes meet after the early worship service as does "Christian Connections," our adult classes. Two new adult classes were added this year to our slate of ongoing classes which leads us to the question — What classes or groups might we want to offer if our Sunday morning schedule is to shift?

Time for fellowship on Sunday morning has also been important at TUMC. Our coffee fellowship now takes place in the parlor at 10:00 AM, between the worship services. Providing an opportunity to meet and greet friends, guests, and new attendees is another important aspect of what happens on Sunday mornings. We will want our Sunday morning schedule to be sure to include time for fellowship and connecting.

Included in this January issue of the *High Spire* is a Sunday morning schedule survey (see pages 3-5). I encourage you to fill it out online or in the paper form provided and return it to the church office by January 14. The Sunday Morning Planning Team wants to hear from you! On Sunday, January 25 after each worship service (9:00 & 11:00), there will be a time to hear and give feedback to a proposed way forward. The discussion will take place in the sanctuary at 10:00 and at noon.

Thank you for your support and prayers as we discern together what God would have us do.

Scripture Readings in Worship The Lectionary

In January and February, we will be using the Common Lectionary in Sunday morning worship services. The Common Lectionary is a three-year cycle of scripture readings which was developed by an ecumenical of Biblical scholars consultation and denominational representatives from the United States and Canada for use by many of the mainline denominations. Some of the denominations which use the Common Lectionary include the Episcopal Church, Presbyterian Church, Evangelical Lutheran Church, Roman Catholic Church, and the United Methodist Church. The Common Lectionary contains four recommended scripture readings for each Sunday in the year. These readings usually include an Old Testament Reading, a New Testament Reading, a Gospel Reading, and a reading from one of the Psalms. There is often a theme which links the scripture passages to one other. Margery and Rod sometimes preach from the Common Lectionary and at other times the scripture readings are chosen for a particular sermon series. We will have the added experience of hearing lectionary scriptures read from our new pew Bibles in 2015 (see p. 10).


