## Pastor's Letter

#### **Outlook for TUMC**

In a few months, our church will be experiencing a change in pastors. Transitions can be times of both excitement and nervousness. While I am still in the pastor's chair, I would like to share my perspective about our church today. At this time, I am more hopeful about TUMC's future than ever before. Here are some of the reasons why I am high on TUMC:

- ★ Finances are strong. Yes, we do need to monitor our budget and we continue to need everyone's support to keep moving forward. And there are strong positives for our church financially (see below).
- ★ We ended 2016 (and 2015) in the black. All bills were paid and we had some excess which will help us if "dry" periods come along.
- ★ The total contributed for our "Growing Forward Capital Journey" now exceeds \$1,000,000 and counting. This is a tremendous achievement by our church.
- ★ Plans are in the works to complete most of the projects outlined in "Growing Forward". Exterior painting and "cladding" will take place when the weather allows. Sanctuary windows are in process and we will have more information about them soon.
- ★ A tremendous number of improvements have been made throughout the building to support ministry including: New sanctuary sound system, hearing assists, microphones, sound board, projector and screen; new cribbery security (coming soon), new phone system (less expensive than the last one and coming soon), office renovation, new closet space and parking lot patched.
- ★ We continue to have a strong staff who support the ongoing ministries of the church.

I am more and more encouraged by the ways in which our congregation is working together which strengthens our programs and ministries. God has graced us with many, many gifts. We are far from perfect, but God has

- ★ Our youth group is the strongest it has been in many years. With the addition of Rachel, our new director of youth and young adult ministries, the strong support of parents and the exuberance of our youth, it is a vibrant and growing program in our church.
- ★ Involvement by members of the congregation in the ministries of the church are at an all time high. Through the efforts of "Servants in Service", people have stepped forward to serve in an increasing variety of ways. This is a big positive for our church.
- ★ Creative and fun fellowship events are sponsored by a variety of individuals and groups and are widely attended and enjoyed by our congregation.
- ★ Sunday worship experiences are inspiring, meaningful, uplifting, and spiritually supportive. Our choirs, liturgists, hospitality, fellowship, and weekly messages are working together to help us continue to build a strong foundation in God, the Bible and life.
- ★ New friends are coming to the church and many are quickly becoming engaged in the life and ministries of the church.
- ★ Mission support and involvement continues to be a strength.
- ★ Opportunities for learning and spiritual growth for all ages are well attended and well-led.



Goat, full price is \$120, a share is \$10 Water Buffalo, full price is \$250, a share is \$25 Sheep, full price is \$120, a share is \$10 Rabbits or a Flock of Hope, full price is \$60

Heifer (a cow), full price is \$500, a share is \$50 Alpaca, full price is \$150, a share is \$20 Pig, full price is \$120, a share is \$10 Flock of Ducks, Chicks, or Geese are \$20


