



Pastor's Letter

Servants in Service is Growing

An acorn idea called **Servants in Service** which was developed by a small task force and planted in the church through a sermon given by Mike Steer on September 13 has taken root and is developing sprouts of new life in our church. **Servants in Service** is a program designed to highlight specific ways for members and friends to serve God and the church today.



I certainly do not know all of what goes on behind

the scenes in the many ministries which support and emanate from TUMC. We have always had many dedicated members, generously supporting the church by their time, talents, and gifts. The new **Servants in Service** program is simply providing an open door and a clear path for serving God and the church by meeting identified needs in our church. Here are some examples of how people are responding through **Servants in Service**.

I am pleased to share that we now have 3 persons, and a substitute, who will be sharing time as receptionists in our church office. They will regularly come in on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday between 10:00 am - 2:00 pm and Kim Ayres, our Business Manager, will continue to cover on Thursday and Friday.

We also have a number of people who have offered to communicate with our home-bound members with cards and calls. Some of these persons are homebound themselves! Some others are offering to visit members in their homes, hospitals, and rehab centers. Caring for our own who are unable to come to church is a big task at TUMC and we welcome anyone who would like to serve. Robin Smith is doing an excellent job of gathering information and organizing this ministry. She will be glad to include you in whatever way you are led to serve.

It will not be too much longer before we have a projector in the sanctuary again so that we can display words, videos, photos, and lyrics. At the same time, we have a pretty sophisticated sound board in the balcony booth. We need trained persons to work with Cathy Anderson, our Director of Communications, each week in the sound and video aspects of Sunday morning worship. It is a joy to share that along with our already trained ninth grader and adult, two fifth graders and a parent has stepped in to be trained to operate these systems. We are inspired by their willingness to serve.

Elsewhere in this issue of the *High Spire* (p. 12), you will see an article by Susan Killian about **Servants in Service**. She is the overall coordinator of the program and is the person to contact if you are interested in serving the church in some way. Take a look and then pray about how you might become involved. A big thanks to Susan for her own contribution as a servant in service!





I'll have a new speaker and a new topic each week. I live with 13 other girls. God was watching over me because I only have one roommate. While some rooms are four girls. I plan to write a blog post every Sunday. Please keep me, my 13 'roommates', our 1 guy, and 7 leaders in your prayers. Thanks."

In her 10/16 blog (<u>alliesgapyear.blogspot.com/</u>) she wrote, "Hello! So last week I went on local outreach and met with women who are on the streets. This will be something I do every other Saturday morning. The days I don't go on local outreach I'll be praying for the group(s) who went out. I wish I could tell you more but unfortunately I can't. Once I get home I can talk more about my experience.

"So big news!!!!!!!!! I found out where I'm going for outreach yesterday (Thursday). First my school was broken up into groups and we had to do a scavenger hunt. We collected envelopes during the scavenger, which contained letters and we had spell out the locations. The locations are Thailand/Cambodia and Costa Rica/Brazil. We then prayed about where we felt God was calling us and the leaders made the teams that way.

TOY DRIVE


