Pastor's Letter

Special Summer Events

One of the summer events I looked forward to growing up was the Saturday each year that my parents bought 200 ears of corn from a local farmer. We filled the car, brought them home and created a family assembly line outside on the back porch: one of us cut off the ends while three of us husked and de-silked. Any of our friends that happened to visit that day were roped in, sometimes to their surprise. Meanwhile in the kitchen, Mom and Dad put them in boiling water and after a few minutes, took them out and sealed them in freezer bags. Loud banter and laughing always went along with the process. Because we worked together, we enjoyed eating corn on the cob all year long.

Summer is a good time to get involved in something that you don't do the rest of the year with the promise of future payoffs.

My mother-in-law made strawberry jam every summer which we paired with her home-made rolls for those special family dinners through the year. I am enjoying working in our garden now, planting flowers and shrubs, and watching them bloom and grow as the summer progresses.

This is a time for us to consider what we can do to lay the groundwork for future ministry at TUMC. Two summers years ago, a large team prepared by focusing on the "Growing Forward" initiative. Last summer we planned together to create the "Servants in Service" volunteer program. This year we are anticipating the strengthening of our youth and young adult ministries. At this writing, we are in discussions about hiring a youth and young adult ministry staff person. Financial resources are tight, and we want to be sure we know what will be expected of this person. We need to be clear that a new staff person will be at their best if they are surrounded by interested, supportive, and helpful people both in the youth program and in the church as a whole. 

Planned Giving Corner

Many people create or update their Last Will and Testament because they know it's the responsible thing to do. All undesignated bequests are invested in the church's General Endowment Fund.



MY HOME, AMERICA

From Atlantic to Pacific, to the golden fields of grain,
From high and mighty mountains to the gently rolling plain,
Her air is sweet with liberty, and blest from Heav'n above,

Her deep majestic canyons and her ocean's mighty roar.
Her big industrious cities, skyscrapers sleek and tall—

From thickly wooded forest lands that meet the sapphire sky

This is the land where freedom sings her great and noble song,

From Old Glory flying high and proud, and waving in the breeze,
Her stars and stripes so beautiful, proclaiming liberty,
To nighttime on the prairie, when the skies just pop with stars,
This is my home, America, the land that thrills my heart.

I love her bounteous countryside, her wide and fruitful earth,
For this the place I love the best, the country of my birth.
Her song of freedom ever rings, from coast to gleaming coast—
This is my home, America, the land I love the most.

I wrote this poem on the Fourth of July in 2013, a celebration
of our beautiful country.*

**I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of
America, and to the republic for which it stands, one
nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice
for all.**

In June 1776, George Washington commissioned Betsy Ross, a seamstress from Philadelphia, to create a new flag in anticipation of independence for the colonies. Adopted by the Continental Congress on June 14, 1777, the flag was to be “13 stripes of alternating red & white, with a union of 13 stars of white in a blue field representing the new constellation.” The flag was first carried at the Battle of Brandywine on September 11 [9/11], 1777.

Francis Scott Key penned the poem “Star-Spangled Banner” September 14, 1814, following the battle at Fort Mchenry, during the War of 1812. Key was temporarily held captive on the British ship HMS *Surprise* during the rainy night of the 13th of September where he witnessed the bombardment of the fort. A smaller “storm flag” continued to fly over the fort through the night. At dawn on the 14th, when the smoke settled, Key said he did not know how the battle turned out until he saw that the storm flag had been lowered and the larger flag was raised. This flag of 15 stars and stripes had been made by Mary Young Pickersgill with other workers on Pratt Street in Baltimore.

Since the original flag in 1777, there have been 27 official versions with the current version dating to July 4, 1960 when Hawaii became the 50th state.

Now when I think of the flag, I think of the Pledge of Allegiance. First composed by Colonel George Balch in 1887, revised by Francis Bellamy, a socialist minister in 1892 and formally adopted by Congress in 1942 with the official name adopted in 1945. The last change in language came on Flag Day, 1954 when the words “under God” were added, and that took a while! Louis Bowman, an attorney in Illinois and later a chaplain for the Illinois Society of Sons of American Revolution, led at a meeting the Pledge of Allegiance and included “under God” and in 1952 at their annual meeting adopted a resolution urging universal change to include “under God” and sent this to the President of the United States, Vice-President, and Speaker of the House. President Eisenhower urged Congress to adopt the resolution and signed the Bill on June 14, 1954.
